Current Requirements



New Requirements (from Jan 2015)

Types of Incidents you must report to OSHA

Fatality

8 hr reporting period



Fatality

8 hr reporting period

Multiple hospitalization of 3 or more people

8 hr reporting period



Hospitalization of 1 or more people

24 hr reporting period

No requirement to report bodily injuries



Amputation or loss of eye

24 hr reporting period

If a fatality occurs 30 days after the incident it must still be reported to OSHA.

All industries must report any incident from above, NO exceptions

Changes to Industries that need to keep OSHA records
